

This is the year for the catechism in the three-year cycle we use for confirmation. We have just finished up with the 10 commandments and will move on to the Apostles' Creed after the new year.

What looks like constraints on the surface are a gift from God which if followed by everyone, would make life better for all. Luther understood that when he reminded us to fear and love God and then he goes on to give positive examples of keeping the commandment such as "Do not kill" also means to look out for your neighbor's every need. Not only are we to "Not bear false witness", but we are to speak well of and explain our neighbor's actions in the best way possible (there goes talk radio!) See, I just broke the commandment!

Since many people make New Year's resolutions, looking at the guidance of the Small Catechism is a good place to start! If that doesn't work, then Lent begins on March 6th and the seven weeks is about the time it takes to establish a new habit. Focused attention and even small changes can add up over time.

In an article in Gather, the magazine for the Women of the ELCA, Karen Bockelman tells of an experiment she tried when he daughter suffered from "night terrors" those bad dreams which are common for young children. An article in a magazine had suggested that when her daughter started crying uncontrollable, she should wake her just a little and ask if she was having a bad dream. She said, "When my daughter answered yes, I said no wonder. You are sleeping on the bad dream side of the pillow. Let's turn it over so you can sleep on the good dream side." She responded immediately, her tears dried, she snuggled back to bed and fell asleep. It worked repeatedly.

Brockelman continued," Children need a concrete reason to change their thinking, Adults too can benefit from a different perspective, although it's a bit more complicated than flipping over a pillow."

Her primary example is that our culture focuses on "Scarcity" and the idea of a "zero-sum" game, where whatever others have takes away from us.....

To "flip the pillow" we need to remind ourselves that God is a God of abundance! Over and over again we read in the gospels that God provides more than enough.... more wine, more bread and fish, more living water and even life itself....

Can you in the new year, both look for God at work and also BE a sign of God's abundant love for others?

Let me know what happens.

God's abundant and ever-present love be with you all!

CONFIRMATION


Confirmation classes will resume on Wednesday, January 9th at Grace Lutheran Church.
