What a winter this has been! So far, we haven't missed worship on Sunday morning, but I wonder each Wednesday whether to have confirmation class or not! It's a good thing that Lent hasn't begun yet...but it is coming soon....March 6, Ash Wednesday service will be at Bakke. Supper will be at 6 and worship starts at 7 p.m. The following week, worship will be at Grace, and will alternate throughout the season.

On April 10th the final service will be at St. Peter's in rural Audubon, featuring a concert for the congregations involved in this year's round robin worship. Each of the pastors is choosing a different Psalm upon which to focus.

Holy Week services will be Maundy Thursday, April 18 at Bakke with supper before and Good Friday service will be at Grace at 7 p.m. without a meal before. Some people practice fasting on Good Friday and I am guessing that the advertisements on TV for fish meals will be starting soon, since some folks do not eat meat during Lent.

Have you thought about how you want to observe the season? The tradition is to be intentional about fasting, praying and giving alms. Think about picking a favorite charity, giving up a weekly or daily treat and then giving the proceeds to the charity that you save by not purchasing your "usual."

Whatever activity that makes you more aware, or more disciplined about your life is worth a try. Barbara Brown Taylor, a writer and Episcopal priest wrote about a pact she made with a friend one Lenten season to be accountable to each other regarding a bad habit...in BBT's case, it was being late for meetings. The act of having to answer to another person made her much more mindful of what made her late and how she could be intentional about breaking the habit.

I think I have mentioned that being intentional about flossing my teeth was my discipline one Lenten season and I still am aware on the impact of not taking habits for granted and am more mindful of this simple act.

Perhaps your discipline will be to be more intentionally grateful to God and you will name out loud gifts you notice in your daily life. Maybe you will decide to choose a person a day to pray on behalf of and make that your practice. Lent does not have to be a time of gloom the way it was in the past...you can add to your life with the habits and prayerful disciplines you practice.

<u>† Property</u>---2 bids were presented for adding 2 gas furnaces as backup for Geo-Thermal. Discussion followed. Decision was to give Fingalson Heating & Cooling the bid---\$10,220. Gerry and Blace will meet with Jared to finalize details.

<u>**†** Education/Youth</u>---March 3rd will be Camp Sunday with a representative coming to talk during worship service and Sunday School. A special offering will be taken for camp scholarships.

<u>**†**</u> Stewardship/Benevolence</u>---Lillian Nybo and Traci Mace will co-chair the committee. Proceeds from the Cabin Fever Supper will be used for furnace repairs with a percentage given to a local charity.

<u>† Evangelism/Outreach</u>---Jim Brogren and Traci Mace will cochair this committee. Jim reported on the Hotdish & Bar Challenge. \$430 was taken in. \$200 will be donated to "A Place to Belong", \$200 to "Becker County Energize", and the remainder to the furnace fund.

<u>+</u> Worship---Lenten services were discussed. Lenten Services are round robin with meals beginning at 6:00 P.M. and worship at 7:00 P.M. April 10th a concert will be held at St. Peter's, Audubon, at 7:00 P.M. with a potluck meal at 6:00 P.M.


"A Place to Belong"---\$200.00 "Becker County Energize"---\$200.00 Furnace Fund---\$30.00

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation classes are now being held at Grace Lutheran through April. During Lent, the Confirmation classes will not be held, but students are encouraged to attend the Lenten worship services. Two of the ten required sermon notes are to be from Lenten Worship Services. Lenten worship services will begin on Ash Wednesday, March 6th which will be held at Bakke. Wednesday Lenten worship services will be held at Grace on March 13th and 27th. On March 20th and April 3rd, the worship services will be at Bakke Lutheran. There is no Confirmation class on April 17th. The last Confirmation class is May 8th.

A reminder to the students, you should be working towards completion of your requirements for this confirmation year. Please talk to Pastor Ann if you are unsure of what requirements you still need to complete.

There will be 4 opportunities for you to complete the 2 service project requirements. Students may help out during the Cabin Fever Supper on March 2nd. On April 14th, Palm Sunday, the Confirmation students will be holding a brunch following the worship service. Confirmation students will be responsible for providing and serving the food. An egg bake has been suggested. More details will be forthcoming during Confirmation classes.

Students may also help during the Rummage Sale on Friday May 3rd and Saturday May 4th. See Gale LaFerriere or Michelle Peterson to find out what you can do to help with this event.

The final opportunity for a service project will be helping with Vacation Bible School in June. Dates will be announced later.

Students are encouraged to sign up to be a lector, usher, or greeter during worship service. Students are required to provide these services 5 times during the Confirmation year.

Thanks to those students who have been handing in their sermon notes. Please check to make sure you are close to completing the 10 required sermon notes.
