This is how he makes the distinction. "Tolerance is lukewarm at best, condescending at worst. It's putting up with what we're not wild about. Enduring someone we disapprove of, trying to demonstrate we're unprejudiced. "

The reality is that there are strong differences in how people approach the world. Some of the differences are really too strong to ignore, however it is possible to try to warm up to another person and by being curious discover what gives them joy. The difficulty is trying to overcome what we fear about another.

We know that within our congregations, our communities, and our nation, there are stark divisions. Tolerance may be a necessity, but as Marty says, "elevating such behavior to default status will never be good enough for Jesus who said, 'Love your neighbor', not 'tolerate your neighbor'."

When St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians when they were in conflict, he reminded them that they had a common purpose which was to be the body of Christ. The head of the body is Christ, all the rest of the parts of the body have particular purposes and all are important in making the body work together. Remember the times you have stubbed a toe or gotten a paper cut and how even that small injury made your whole being hurt!

Bless each other by your presence as we worship together, work together, pray together and sing together. The Love of God is the glue that holds us together.

Blessings to you as we continue to enjoy the good news of Easter: Christ is Risen, Christ is Risen Indeed!

† Cabin Fever expenses and Pathways Camp registrations are included in the March expenses. All designated funds for the furnaces have been transferred. Remainder of the furnace bill will be paid with funds taken from the Maintenance Fund and Undesignated Memorials.


