Since prophets are required by God to call into question how things have "always been" they are endangering themselves when they put to voice God's call for justice.

As Eugen Peterson writes in THE MESSAGE as he introduces the book of Amos: "if we pray and worship God and associate with others who pray and worship God, we absolutely must keep company with these biblical prophets to prevent the perversion of our religion into something self-serving."

There are times that we need to pay attention to what discomforts and determine what is being said that causes us to want to step back.

In the parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man, the rich man begs Father Abraham to send a warning to his brothers so that they do not suffer the same fate as he does. He's told that the brothers have all the information that they need since they have Moses and the prophets. We have even more since Jesus who has returned from the dead shows us how to live.

Blessing to you as you live out your lives with faith and open ears to hear God's word and the courage to follow where God leads.


