

Christmas blessings! Did you know we are only two months away from Ash Wednesday?

Since it moves around according to the lunar calendar, we have to check every year to see where in the six weeks of possibilities it lands.

I have found over the years that if I want to make changes in my life, Lent works better than making New Year's resolutions. Maybe it's because 40 days works better than having something open ended, or maybe it's because it takes about six weeks to change a habit and that's about how long Lent lasts.

If you are of the mindset to make a resolution this year, may I suggest asking yourself the question WHY AM I DOING THIS? So many people complain about being too busy, or as someone has suggested, we sometimes "brag" about how busy we are to make ourselves feel more important or to have an excuse to refuse to do something we don't really want to do.

Some people suffer from FOMO.....Fear Of Missing Out, so they put more things on their calendar than they are comfortable doing.

Some people find that they cannot say no, so they agree to do things they don't really want to do and many times back out at the last minute with an excuse so they don't have to do something they never should have agreed to in the first place. It can be aggravating to the person who asked in the first place if they cannot count on a yes meaning "Yes."

The book, <u>Margin</u>, encourages people to build some leeway into their lives.....with their time, money; emotional energy and physical energy.....when we don't stretch ourselves too thin to begin with, we will have more space to genuinely say Yes to events that come our way.

God commanded that we honor the Sabbath Day to keep it holy. God knows that we both need to worship and to rest when needed. Look at your life at the beginning of the year and see if you are living it faithfully and intentionally. You are created by God to be the unique individual that you are, you are beloved as you are and don't have to prove anything to anyone by your busyness or by what "stuff" you have accumulated. Simplifying your life is a gift you can give yourself and opens up margins and breathing room so that you can live in each moment you have been given.

(UNAPPROVED) COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS—December 17, 2019)

- † Meeting was called to order.
- † Devotions given by Jim Brogren.
- † Correspondence was read and discussed. Action taken: Given the number of benevolence requests, suggest one of the entities receive a % from Polar Fest Hotdish Cook-off and another from the Cabin Fever Supper. In addition, Treasurer will provide a monthly list of benevolence to Council each month to help visualize budgets and tracking of giving through the year.
- † Secretary report approved as read.
- † Finance report approved as printed.

- \* Expenses were normal, but income was low. There is a question on D.L. Disposal bill. Property committee will check into this.
- \* Recommendation to ask current Thrivent Members to consider using their "Thrivent Dollars" for projects that the Church puts on like the upcoming Cabin Fever supper. It really helps to get that \$250 gift card to use for expenses.
- \* In the 2020 Budget, there is intent to add more \$ to the Rainy-Day Fund. Grace Council recommended the budget be submitted for the annual meeting.
- \* Also, would like monthly treasurer reports to include present data verses the budget.
- \* Blace explained the need for a Business Ready Reserve to avoid overdraft charges. The cost is \$50 for 3 years. This was tabled until January 2020 meeting.
- \* 2019 Audit is lined up. Recommended to do the audit BEFORE the annual meeting.
- \* Will be purchasing a new finance program, "Quicken". Blace will get the program and it will be set up by the first of the year.
- † Motion made and carried to designate \$24,000.00 for Pastor Ann's housing allowance in 2019.
- † Committee reports for the Annual Report need to be in by Friday, January 10<sup>th</sup>
- † Pastor gave her report of hospital visits, funeral, meetings, etc.
- <u>† PROPERTY</u>---Coffee maker has been repaired thanks to Gerry Nybo and Blace Schmidt. Glycol was been added to the geothermal but costly, will explore ways to save money. Blace reported on what he has found out about the possibility of selling off some of the land. There are 4 lots currently zoned as residential but could be rezoned business. This will be brought up at the annual meeting. Rental space was also discussed. (See box to the right.)

† EDUCATION/YOUTH--- Confirmation retreat went well. Church paid \$60 of the fee and the student paid \$60. There were 4 boys along with Pastor Ann that attended. The Advent Store and Barnyard Giving brought in \$160 to purchase from ELCA Good Gifts. Christmas program was a hit given only one Saturday 2-hr practice. 100% attendance and assistance by Confirmation class.

sent to Lutheran World Relief.
Confirmation students and church
members took the 50 names off the
Angel Giving Tree and purchased gifts
for the children.


