
Confirmation classes will not be held during the Lenten season; however, the students are to attend the Lenten worship services held on Wednesdays.

<u>SOUPER BOWL OF CARING</u>---On February 2nd Grace will be holding a "Souper Bowl of Caring" for the Becker County Food Pantry. Please bring in a non-perishable food and/or a money donation. A special offering will be taken for the food pantry.

The Souper Bowl of Caring began in 1990 with a simple prayer said by Reverend Brad Smith at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, South Carolina: Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat.

In the first year, 22 churches raised \$5,700 for their area food bank. In 2019, 4,500 groups collected over \$9 million in food and contributions.

Young people started this program and they continue to mobilize annually around the Superbowl to raise money to fight hunger.

All money and food collected at Grace Lutheran will be given to the Becker County Food Pantry. Thank you!
