DO YOU KNOW.....

Lent is a forty-day period before Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday. We skip Sundays when we count the forty days, because Sundays commemorate the Resurrection.

Lent begins on February 26, 2020 and ends on April 11, 2020, which is the day before Easter. Lent always begins on <u>Ash Wednesday</u>, the seventh Wednesday before Easter.

In most churches, the decorations are purple, the royal color, to prepare for the King.

Lent is a season of soul-searching and repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking stock. Lent originated in the very earliest days of the Church as a preparatory time for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. By observing the forty days of Lent, the individual Christian imitates Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for forty days. All churches that have a continuous history extending before AD 1500 observe Lent. The ancient church that wrote, collected, canonized, and propagated the New Testament also observed Lent, believing it to be a commandment from the apostles.

In many countries, the last day before Lent (called Mardi Gras, Shrove Tuesday, Carnival, or Fasching) has become a last fling before the solemnity of Lent. For centuries, it was customary to fast by abstaining from meat during Lent, which is why some people call the festival *Carnival*, which is Latin for *farewell to meat*.

The purpose of the liturgical calendar is to relive the major events in Jesus' life in real time, which is why Lent is forty days long. If Jesus were born on 25 December, then His conception—thus also His incarnation—would have been nine months earlier, on about 25 March. That is when the angel Gabriel would have announced Jesus' birth to Mary. Thus 25 March is known in the historic church as *The Annunciation*.

Our theme for this year's Lent is "The Seven Deadly Sins". Pastors from Grace, First Lutheran in Audubon, Eksjo, and Richwood will have a round robin Lenten Pulpit Exchange.

The **seven deadly sins** can be cured by the **seven virtues**: Below are the seven virtues:

- * *Kindness* cures **envy** by placing the desire to help others above the need to supersede.
- * **Temperance** cures **greed** by putting the desire to help others above storing up treasure for one's self.
- * Charity or love cures greed by putting the desire to help others above storing up treasure.
- * **Humility** cures **pride** by removing one's ego and boastfulness, therefore allowing the attitude of service.
- * **Diligence** or Zeal cures **slothfulness** by placing the best interest of others above the life of ease and relaxation.
- * **Patience** cures **wrath** by taking time to understand the needs and desire of others before acting or speaking.

WRATH---A strong anger and hate towards another person

ENVY---Intense desire to have an item that someone else possesses



PRIDE---An excessive view of one's self without regard for others.

Chicken Nacho Casserole

1 bag Nacho Doritos crushed2 cups shredded chicken

Mix together---1 can cream of chicken soup, 1 can Rotel Tomatoes, ½ cup sour cream, ½ cup milk, ½ package of Taco Seasoning, 1 can black beans

Spray 9x13 pan. Spread ½ bag of crushed Doritos on the bottom of pan. Spread shredded chicken on top of Doritos.

Spread the mixture of items on top of the chicken.

On top layer, spread the rest of crushed Doritos and the shredded cheese.

Bake at 350 degrees for 35 minutes.

Raspberry-White Chocolate Cheesecake Bars

Raspberry Puree

4 cups frozen raspberries

½ cup sugar

2 T water

4 tsp Clear Gel or corn starch (Ava used Clear Gel)

Combine raspberries, sugar, water, and clear gel in a pot and simmer 2-3 min until it begins to thicken. Remove from heat and smash any remaining raspberries. Set aside to cool.

Graham Cracker Crust

3+ cups of graham crackers, crushed

2 T sugar

3/4 tsp salt

6 T melted butter (Ava used salted)

Combine cracker crumbs, sugar, salt and mix. Add melted butter until moistened. Spread mixture in lightly sprayed 9x13 glass pan and press. Bake for about 12 minutes at 350 degrees until the crust is toasty and fragrant. Set aside to cool completely. **Turn oven down**

to 325 degrees.

White Chocolate Cheesecake

32 oz cream cheese, softened at room temperature (4 blocks) 2/3 cup sugar Pinch of salt 14 oz of white chocolate, melted (Ava used white chocolate chips)

4 eggs- room temperature

Beat cream cheese, sugar and salt until fluffy and smooth. Beat in melted white chocolate until combined. Beat in eggs, one at a time; do not overmix. Pour mixture over graham cracker crust and spread into an even layer. Wait 5-10 minutes, the dollop raspberry puree on top of cheesecake layer and swirl designs into top ½ inch of cheesecake. Bake for 28-30 min at 325 degrees. Do not overbake. Cool completely and refrigerate overnight to set.
