
PASTOR ANN'S DAILY/WEEKLY VIDEO CHATS


KEEP SENDING OR BRINGING IN YOUR OFFERINGS!

Dear people of Grace.... How have your lives been changed in the last month? Is that even a question we would want to consider? Is it the kind of question that

comes to us at 3 a.m. when we wish we were asleep, but instead we are staring at the ceiling?

Since nothing like this pandemic has happened to us in our lifetime, all of this is new to us and we are learning as we go through it. We do have records of the experiences of other people in other lifetimes experiencing the Spanish Flu, the Bubonic Plague, wars and famines. We can see what has been helpful, what has caused harm and how people have coped.

I have learned that we can take nothing for granted. I think I knew that before, but it was easy to go about my daily life without worrying about an invisible threat to my life and the life of those around me. I felt free to come and go as I wanted without needing to keep my distance from people. I am grateful for the telephone, for the ability to reach out to others and for them to call me. I am amazed at the creativity of people who make the best of a difficult situation with humor and a sense of joy, as well as those who provide thought-provoking pieces of poetry, music or art.

Dr. David Lose wrote a letter to his congregation last week which in very simple terms can be summed up with the expression "You've got this!" He was commenting on the 10th chapter of John which shows up every year during the 4th Sunday of Easter which we call GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY. Jesus refers to himself as the good shepherd, the gate by which the sheep go in and out to pasture and return to safety and also talks about false shepherds who do not have the interest of the sheep at heart. One of the things he focused on is that the sheep recognize the shepherd's voice and listen to him and follow him....

That is what prompted the response of "You've got this!" "You've got this" is possible because what precedes that message is "I've got you!" Jesus the good shepherd knows what we need, gives us new life, goes before us leading the way and provides for us abundantly. Psalm 23 is also one of the lessons used on Good Shepherd Sunday and is a psalm of trust.... The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want....

Likewise, Romans 8:31-39 reminds us that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.... not even the uncertainty of living through a time of pandemic.

You've got this! Thank you for your faithfulness and care for one another.... thank you to Kathy who has been filming our daily Facebook messages, thank you to Gerry for ringing the bell, Glennis for keeping the office running and to all of you for being good stewards of God's gifts. You've got this because God's got your backs!
