Robb used to get a magazine called THE OLD HOUSE JOURNAL. One of the regular features was called, "The mushroom effect." A couple of weeks ago, Dr. David Lose from Olivet Lutheran Church in Minneapolis had titled a blog post, "The butterfly effect." It's the notion that the flapping of a butterfly's wings can affect the weather because of the compounding of the changes that occur. Our everyday faith practices can make a difference in our character and behavior in far greater proportion than we may acknowledge. We learn to be generous by regular proportionate giving. We strengthen our relationship with God through daily prayer and study. Regular worship and service give us a sense of purpose and give witness to the community.

We know that the simple act of wearing a mask has become a point of contention for people and some judge the character of others upon whether they wear one or not. I wear one for the sake of those around me. I see it as a means of loving my neighbor as myself. Likewise, the council is making decisions regarding worship, not as a matter of "our rights", but how does our behavior affect our neighbors? Our next council meeting will be September 15th and we will re-evaluate our worship practices according to the information available at that time. We are scheduled to continue with parking lot worship through the end of September. We will keep the congregation informed and remember that you are always welcome at the beginning of council meetings if you wish to share information or have questions of the council.
