As I said in last Sunday's sermon, it feels like we have been in the season of Lent for more than a year now! Remember when we thought this would all be over in two weeks' time? I think it all became real for me when the library was closed. My older daughter was an English major when she was in college, so she has a bookcase full of literature in her old room, but she did take all her favorite books with her when she moved to Grand Marais. I am glad the library reopened before I ran through her left-overs!

I remember hoping I could get my haircut and when it finally happened, it seemed I was five pounds lighter! You too, have discovered what you used to take for granted and how many experiences you have been looking forward to as well as how many ways you have learned to adapt as you are challenged by changes.

Through it all, God has been present with us as God has always promised to be.... just as Jesus was proclaimed to be God's beloved child when he came out of the waters of the Jordan....so are we.... claimed by God's promise of love and support and belonging.... given a purpose of bearing witness to God's love for us and for all people.

During the season of Lent we are reminded that taking up the cross of Christ is part of our calling. It means daring to speak out against injustices, being willing to work to change the world for the better of others and not just ourselves, looking at what we think we know "for sure" and being willing to have our suppositions challenged. The message of the cross of Christ is often in opposition to those who hold power. We have to remember that dying to self also means rising with Christ... learning to live as God intends for us to live. You'll hear Peter protest that message again this coming Sunday when Jesus announces what being the Messiah really means for both himself and for the world. Chapter 8 of Mark is the turning point and when Jesus and the disciples leave Caesarea Philippi where the announcement of the cross and resurrection are first made.... the steady journey to Jerusalem and the cross begins.

Lenten services will be on Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. followed by confirmation class. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services will be at 7:00. Thanks to Jim Brogren for faithfully recording our worship services for broadcast on Facebook! It's wonderful for us to have that option as well as the opportunity to worship live in the sanctuary at 9:30 on Sundays. On-line worship is a gift that has come from the pandemic... look around and see what other unexpected gifts you have been blessed with during this last year.... more time to be creative, learning to value simplicity, hearing from old friends by phone or letter....and banana bread!

It's good to know many of you have been able to receive your vaccine! Blessings to you during this season of Lent and know that Easter is coming!
