My first reaction to the three guilty verdicts in the trial of Derek Chauvin was to feel relief. But that is only a start. There is a long way to go from accountability to justice. Truth is the first step, then accountability and then finally justice. That will demand a systemic change and systems are resistant.

Each one of us has a part in upholding or dismantling systems. Think of all the moving parts and the myriad possibilities of how things can change depending upon the people involved. Laws can be written, declarations can be made, mandates can be created, but unless people choose to act justly, to treat others with dignity and respect and as equally valued, justice can be thwarted.

We cannot change the past; we cannot change facts and we cannot change other people. Three difficult truths, but we each can change how we respond to situations or other people. Our response will shift the system, even if it is a small shift, it is a start.

Think of the times you have bitten your tongue when you wish you had spoken up on behalf of another person. Think of the times you have fudged the truth or said something unkind when silence would have been the better option. Think of the times you have held a grudge, withheld forgiveness, gossiped about someone or kept secrets that would have been better revealed. What difference would that small action have made in the greater scheme of things?

When we are faithful in little, we are faithful in much. Being human, though, of course means that we fail at acting as God directs us.... we are still beloved by God, still forgiven by God, still redeemed by God and that is what makes it possible to acknowledge our failures both known and unknown, things that we have done and things we have failed to do. "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us, but if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." 1John 1:8

That promise makes starting over, trying again and being gracious to ourselves and others possible. We can hope for better because the Holy Spirit is at work within each of us and within our community.

Last Sunday was Good Shepherd Sunday, which was a great day to celebrate graduation and confirmation. As I prepared for preaching during the week, I often listened to a piece of music which brings a smile to my face and tears to my eyes..." Psalm 23, the Vicar of Dibley version". 
