

Easter had primary focus for many years. During the time of the Puritans, leaders were alarmed at the excesses of celebrations, banned Christmas parties, and all the hoopla which accompanied the feasting and drinking so many people anticipated each year.

We frequently hear people bemoan how Christmas has been spoiled by too much, by too many expectations, by too much spending. This time of the year can be difficult for those who are grieving, by those experiencing financial problems, by those who have problematic relations with their families.

The pandemic of course has exacerbated problems. That which was fraught before, has become even more a flash point for disagreements. More than ever, we need to remember how Luther explained the 8<sup>th</sup> commandment "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."

"We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead, we are to come to their defense, speak well of them and interpret everything their do in the best possible light."

That might make a good New Year's resolution for each of us.... that we try to reweave the fabric of our connections with people through honest conversations which serve the purpose, not of proving who is right, but of owning our own opinions, taking into account those of the other, agreeing to disagree at times, but trying to find resolutions to problems which require co-operation to resolve.
