I got stuck today. It happens about once a year since we live on a hilly gravel road. Normally, other people have already headed to town and I just follow their tracks and all is fine. Not today. The plow has not come through yet. Robb hadn't been out in his 4- wheel drive pick-up yet and it didn't look too bad where we are, but I couldn't make the small hill by the house with the goats. So, I started to back up thinking I could turn around in at the next drive way and make my way back home.... but you know how it goes, I caught the edge and got sucked into the snow bank, so I walked back home, got Robb, the shovels and the truck and now I am safe and sound and not going anywhere until the plow comes through.

It could have been worse....it could have been dark, or we didn't have the tools we needed or I was by myself.... we do have AAA, but it would have meant a long wait and frustration.

While I was looking for something else in my file cabinet yesterday, I ran across a presentation on prayer which referenced a delightful book called, HELP, THANKS, WOW written by Anne Lamott. She makes the claim that we are familiar with what she calls "The good China" prayers.... the ones that are eloquent and public and formal and really the kind of prayers that make people think that they are not "good" at praying. People want to use the right words and make a good impression on other people and a good impression on God for that matter as if God doesn't already know what is on our minds and in our hearts!

Prayer is meant for relationship.... it's meant to be honest and when we are in trouble.... what is the natural thing to do but call HELP! When we pray "Help" that's a complete sentence! In the course of our time with God we may be able to figure out the source of the problem, and the possible solutions, but starting with Help is a good beginning.

Likewise, saying thank you to God doesn't have to be elaborate.... even the noticing of the many gifts that God gives us is a great beginning. Sometimes, what to be thankful for is obvious, like healing from a disease, a new baby, a great sunset, a needed job.... sometimes, we need to have our eyes open to recognize gifts for what they are....cultivating an attitude of gratitude can go a long way to making our lives more generous and pleasant and can lead us to express the "Wows!"

Walk outside on a stary night, take a good look at a seashell or a flower or even think about how incredible our bodies are, how much information can be stored in a human brain, how much variety there is in creation and we have more than enough reasons to say "Wow!" or we catch our breath and then express our wonder to God.

The season of Lent is a good time to pay attention to all the reasons we have to be grateful to God.... it's a time of intentionality as we practice acts of charity, worship and giving. We are not floundering down a snow covered road, likely to get stuck and frustrated.... we have a well-marked path that leads to the cross of Good Friday and the resurrection to come on Easter....Join with your partners in ministry on the journey.... see you at worship on Wednesdays and Sundays!
