One job I really don't much care for is that of taking out the garbage. These past weeks

have made this job even more unbearable because of the heat. Not only is this now an unbearable job, but it also stinks!!! It stinks because it's a matter of again getting close to those things which have messed up your life in the past. Truly, it's a job I would rather avoid if possible. As is the case today, there are advances which make this job a bit easier to take, but <u>one still has to take out the garbage</u>! It simply isn't enough to put your garbage in a plastic trash bag and think the job is done! To be sure, it may not smell as bad or take as much work as the "old way". Still, one has to go through the actual task of taking out the garbage. Even with all these advances, I haven't encountered anyone who has told me they enjoy this task – unless one looks at it from the standpoint, they are done with it and no longer have to worry about it. (I won't even mention hanging on to the garbage for a couple of weeks just to avoid the task because we all know what an awful task it would be then.)

So, why all this talk of taking out the garbage, you ask? Well, a few weeks ago, I was reminded of this illustration I have used earlier. They mentioned taking out the garbage and worship were the same. When I first heard the analogy, I thought it was poor at best. However, as it was explained to me, there were many similarities.

Don't get me wrong – I'm <u>not</u> saying worship is garbage!

One of the tasks of worship is <u>like</u> taking out the garbage! That task is confessing our sins and hearing the word of forgiveness. When we truly become involved in confessing our sins, it can be a "stinky" job because we're calling to mind all of those things, those sins, which have cluttered our lives and made them unbearable. Our worship time is one of the times we have to "clean house" in our lives and then **"TAKE OUT THE GARBAGE"**. We have failed in the "house cleaning" if we clean out all the corners of our lives and then fail to haul out the garbage to be taken away! For it will only sit there and continue to mess up our lives. The Good News of the Gospel is Jesus has promised to take away the garbage – our sins – if only we "take out the garbage" – that is, confess our sins! That's Good News because no longer will it be there to mess up our lives!

For many, however, the task of "taking out the garbage," (confessing one's sins) is a task we avoid. You have heard me plead with you many times to come and worship. This isn't so much to simply fill the pews as it is to help in our weekly spiritual house cleaning. This time of worship is a time we can confess those things which trouble us. Then, we hear the word of forgiveness – the Good News all the "garbage" has been taken away!!

Oh yes, to extend this analogy a bit more.....

When one goes on vacation, one still accumulates garbage and still must take it out. So it is with our lives. We may go on vacation during the summer, but we still need to take the time to worship in order to "take out the garbage" which gathers in our lives.

Lillian seconded the motion. Motion carried.

† <u>Finance report</u> approved as printed. Rummage Sale brought in \$1,603.27. A \$50 donation was given at the Synod Assembly.
