

### January 2024



It's a rare occasion when one will spend much time marveling over a street light. Still, it has to be a very under-rated addition to our lives. We rely upon them for security around our homes. We expect them to light our way as we take an evening walk. We depend upon them to make our town look friendly and inviting. We simply trust they will be there doing their job every time we need some extra light.

Most of today's street lights are equipped with a photo-electric cell. This senses when it's becoming dark (even if it's a storm in the middle of the day) and turns on the light. Thus, there is light when we need it.

Many years ago, I noticed some boys one summer evening taking delight in shining their flashlights at the photo-electric cells of the street lights and causing them to turn off. They figured their little flashlights were more powerful than those street lights. True,.... their flashlights did **SEEM** more powerful. Still, their flashlights couldn't offer the security nor the lighting one street light provided. Their flashlights were no match for the brightness and warmth of the street light.

John, in the first chapter of the gospel which bears his name, describes Jesus as the light which was coming into the world. He was the "true light which enlightens everyone". Then, John goes on to say the world didn't know or even recognize Jesus. He even went to those who should have known him – the places and people familiar to him – and they still didn't know him! In other words, they shut him out of their lives. They didn't allow his light and life to enlighten them. They figured what **they had** and what **they knew** would be enough to get them by! They didn't need Jesus to do anything for them!

Unfortunately, we're very much like the people about whom John writes. We, too, feel the "light" <u>we</u> bring to the world outshines the light which Jesus brings. We puff ourselves up and prance about only to realize the light we have to offer is like shining a flashlight at a street light. It looks strong for a moment from our point of view, but doesn't offer the broad and lasting light which Jesus brings into our lives!

Christmas is a time we celebrate this light of Christ coming into the world. It's a good and joyous time. Still, the season of the church year which follows Christmas is also important and necessary. It's the season of Epiphany. Epiphany is the time when the readings focus on how Christ has been revealed. In our own lives, it can be an opportunity to recognize the times and places and people through whom Christ and his love is made known to us today!

With this in mind, may we be caught up in the joy and excitement of recognizing the many ways in which Christ makes himself known to us each day!

May this season of discovery truly be a blessing for you! Pastor Mike Schendel
