March 2024

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace, who brings good news, who announces salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." {Isaiah 52:7 (NRSV)}

This was the text for the sermon on my ordination day. The preacher spoke of the role of a clergyperson to bring the good news to people. I have remembered that text for all these years. How unlikely it was to talk of someone's beautiful feet? Even then, I never thought of my feet as being beautiful. In fact, I always thought it best to keep mine covered. Still, one's feet, as unlikely and unheralded and often dirty as they are, are made beautiful when they carry the good news which brings life and hope to others! This one sentence tucked away in scripture announces to us so clearly each of us is important in God's plan. For each of us has been equipped to carry the good news to the world – no matter who we are.

Years ago, a mother of a young boy was talking with me. She told me one of the aides at school had been supervising the playground when she overheard the young boy say to his friends, "we should let Billy play because I heard in church that we are supposed to be friends to everyone." I was very pleasantly pleased not just that the message was being heard, but also lived! Imagine, a child whom we often overlook as being a messenger of the Gospel was very effectively sharing the good news and influencing the world! God can and does use any and all of his children!

I was recently at a prayer service for a lady who had died. For several years, she had lived in a nursing home. Every evening, she would read her Bible. One evening, her roommate who was nearly blind asked her what she was doing. The lady mentioned she was reading her Bible. The roommate asked if she would read out loud so she could hear, too. A couple of days after the lady died, the chaplain visited the roommate. As they visited, the roommate asked, "who will read the Bible to me?" How beautiful are the feet – those feet confined to a wheelchair, feet which no longer bore weight – how beautiful are *those* feet which brought good news! And once again, a person often overlooked by society is sharing the Gospel in a very important way!

Those are two examples. We, in the "prime of our lives" (and we can define that as we wish), have so many opportunities. Every day we're presented with occasions to share God's love in a special way. Do **we** share the Gospel as willingly as the people I just mentioned?

We've come through the celebration of Jesus' resurrection! The Good News has been made known to us. And now, it's left to us to share this good news. We serve a God who is able to use each of us. It doesn't matter whether we are male or female, young or old, rich or poor, Lutheran or Catholic or Presbyterian. God has called us to be his messengers.

Go out with the Gospel! Go out into every corner of your life with the Gospel! May God bless you and your beautiful feet as you share the Gospel! Pastor Mike Schendel

- † Meeting was called to order by President Jim Brogren Jr.
- † Devotions given by Gerry Nybo.
- † Correspondence was read and it was decided to support our Grace Café & Food Pantry.
- † Secretary report approved with correction that Lenten supper offerings are going to the air conditioning fund.
- † Finance report approved as printed.

It was suggested that all doors be kept shut in the older part of the building since there are no sprinkler systems there. Need for security cameras at entrances. Tom will check on cost of shredding old records. R U Ready Lawn Care will do the weed spraying around the rock areas of church. † EDUCATION/YOUTH----Mardi Gras celebration Pancake Breakfast fed 50 people. Games were held following the breakfast. Confirmation requirements were discussed. All requirement must be met before student can be confirmed. † STEWARDSHIP/BENEVOLENCE---Lenten supper offering going to Sanctuary Air Conditioning. \$459 was raised through the Hotdish Challenge. It was donated to the Grace Café.

† WORSHIP---On Palm Sunday a light breakfast was served. Easter Sunday rolls will be served by the council. **†OLD BUSINESS**—Rental policy was presented and reviewed. It was accepted by the Council. Kraig Erickson will be showing how to use the scrubber for the fellowship hall floors. It was clarified that Lillian Nybo is the funeral coordinator and the wedding coordinator is Glennis Olson.

<u>† NEW BUSINESS</u>—Meatball/Pork Dinner will be held on Friday, April 19th. It will be a drive-thru or eat in. The cost is \$10 per plate. There will be a choice of either meatballs or pork loin.
