My friends and I stood in the entry of a church in a neighboring town. We talked nervously as we waited for our turn to go before the Board of Review. This was the final requirement we faced for earning the rank of Eagle Scout. My memory of that is somewhat fuzzy except for one thing. Our scoutmaster gave us some last-minute advice which has stuck with me since that evening. He said, "Watch what you say. They want to know you really believe in some things... that you have some strong convictions. When you talk about things you believe in, say 'I believe'. Don't just say 'I think'."

That bit of advice, as I said, has stayed with me. I think of it whenever I'm asked about something which seeks a response from me. Is it something I believe, or is it simply an opinion which doesn't matter that much to me. This has caused me to examine things a bit more carefully. I've found myself asking if something is important enough to affect my life. For if I believe something, it should affect how I think and live.

All too often, we sluff off this kind of examination as we look at our faith walk. Rather than sticking out our neck to state, "I believe...," we'll settle for a much easier, "I think...". This way, we don't really have to defend our statements. If there's any opposition, we can abandon our statements as quickly as we toss a glass of unused water down the drain. In the end, we don't hold on to anything. We simply drift from idea to idea holding on only long enough to hear the first challenge. Not much matters.

God doesn't look for His children to live in this way. Many Christians feel this is the way to live so as not to offend anyone. Not so!! God spoke to John in a vision and told him to write to the church at Laodicea, "I know your works; you are neither cold nor hot. I wish that you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth." (Revelation 3:15-16)

So, what's God trying to tell us? He's telling us He has no use for those who BELIEVE nothing. He even would rather people would believe in something contrary to Him so they could at least be confronted with the folly of their beliefs. Those who believe nothing refuse to hold on to anything long enough for it to make a difference in their life. God expects us to BELIEVE in Him. He expects our belief – our faith – to give shape and direction to our lives! Without this response to the Gospel, our faith is dead.

During this Lenten season, I would encourage each of us to examine our lives. Let's take a look at what we really believe. What really shapes our life? What is it that drives us? If we find Christ is not the real center of our life, then it's time to ask for forgiveness and the strength and commitment to allow Him the center spot in our life!

May God help you as you look at your life and your faith. The Good News is He is with you every moment of the way. May this be for each of us a time of renewal in the faith!

SUNDAY SCHOOL


- * Sunday School classes held every Sunday beginning at 10:00 A.M.

(UNAPPROVED) COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS February 11, 2024)

- † Meeting was called to order by President Jim Brogren Jr.
- † Devotions given by Lillian Nybo
- † Correspondence was read. None
- † Secretary report approved as read.
- † Finance report approved as printed.

Council agreed to giving the Northwest MN Synod \$100 for mission work. Audit was completed with good results.

- **† PROPERTY**—Geo-Thermal fluid will need to be ordered again. A date will be set up to use the scrubber to wash the Fellowship Hall floor. Jim will contact Kraig Erickson to see when he could help us with the scrubber.
- <u>† EDUCATION/YOUTH</u>---The Mardi Gras pancake breakfast will be held on Sunday, February 25th. The council will help with the Pancake Breakfast. Proceeds will go towards Camp Scholarships. The Palm Sunday breakfast which was to be put on by the Confirmation students will be postponed until later due to sports conflicts. Instead, Ranae and Glennis will be serving rolls on that day.
- † STEWARDSHIP/BENEVOLENCE \$100 was given to Pathways Bible Camp on Giving Hearts Day by the Christian Education committee. Jim will look into getting Grace Café on the list for the next Giving Hearts Day.
- <u>† WORSHIP-</u>Use of the projection screen for scripture lessons was discussed. It has been accepted with mixed feelings. Words need to be bigger and should be bold in order to be read from the back of the sanctuary. Also, the Christ Candle needs to be moved as it blocks seeing the screen for some people. Rolls will be served on Easter Sunday. Lenten schedule was reviewed: supper at 5:30 P.M. Worship service held in sanctuary at 6:30 P.M.
- <u>† OLD BUSINESS-</u>Rental agreement was discussed. It was decided that members need to give a minimal fee. A deposit fee will be required from all. This will be refundable if after inspection everything is alright. Ranae and Glennis volunteered to develop a policy which will be brought to the next council meeting for approval.
- **† NEW BUSINESS**-A coat rack was moved to Grace Café entrance by Gerry. This will keep clothes items from food items.
