

Greetings, beloved community. What a summer it's been, flowers in bloom, corn taller than most of us, a little more smoke in the air than we'd hoped, and the young ones now heading back to school. I pray you've all found moments of rest and restoration in the warmth of the season.

As we turn toward fall, our worship will center on the Gospel of Luke, where Jesus speaks in parables that challenge our priorities and call us to reorient our lives around the radical love and justice of God. Each Sunday, we'll explore a different facet of discipleship and each week, you'll have opportunities to live it out in community.

#### A Call to Radical Discipleship:

**Preaching Text for Sun. Sep. 7<sup>th</sup>, Luke 14:25–33** – *The Cost of Discipleship:* Jesus reminds us that following him requires intention, sacrifice, and a willingness to let go.

As we step into this season together, may we do so with open hands and willing hearts. <u>GOD'S WORK...OUR HANDS---</u>Donations are need for our God's Work...Our Hands Sunday which will be held on Sunday, September 7th. We will be assembling "Blizzard Boxes" for the Meals on Wheels Program in Detroit Lakes. These "Blizzard Boxes" are given during a time when snow or a blizzard prevents them from deliveries.
