"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it." – John 1:5

As I read John 1:5, I'm reminded that this season of fall. While rich in color and harvest it can also feel heavy for many. Just a few weeks ago, the morning sun guided me on my way to the church. Now, I find myself driving in shadow. Yet that shadow offers its own grace: a quiet space to reflect, as both the caffeine and the Spirit begin to awaken me for the day ahead.

For some of us, the darker the day, the harder it is to see the light of God, who burns bright even in the darkness. And yet, this is the promise we cling to: "I am the light of the world," Jesus says in John 8:12. "Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." That light is not seasonal. It does not flicker with the weather. It is eternal spoken through the Law and the Gospel and sealed in the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Still, I want to name something that affects many in our community: Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD). It's a form of depression that often emerges in the fall and winter months, when sunlight wanes. Symptoms may include fatigue, sadness, changes in sleep or appetite, and a loss of interest in things that once brought joy. It's not just "the winter blues" it is real, and treatable. Light therapy, counseling, and connection with others can make a profound difference.

If you find yourself struggling, please know you are not alone. Reach out to a friend, a doctor, or to me. The church is not just a place of worship; it's a place of refuge. And the light of Christ is not just a metaphor it is a living presence, burning within and around you.

John 1:4–5 reminds us: "In him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it." That is the truth we proclaim even when the skies are gray, even when our spirits feel dim. The light of Christ is not seasonal. It is resurrection light. It is the light of life.

So, let us not grow weary. Let us walk together, even in shadow. And let us be gentle with ourselves and one another, trusting that the light of our Lord is already here.






WANT A PART TIME JOB?
